Together with our 2025 election commitments, we are building on our 2030 Strong Plan for Tasmania's Future.

And this 100-day plan will deliver both.

We're ready to get on with the job, again.

So, within 100 days of being sworn in, a re-elected Tasmanian Liberal Government will:

- ✓ Announce and swear in the new Cabinet, including appointing Tasmania's first Minister for Ageing.
- ✓ Set Key Performance Indicators for all Ministers.
- ✓ Get on with the job by presenting the 100-day plan to the Head of the State Service for immediate action.
- ✓ Refresh Performance Agreements for all Heads of Agencies.
- ✓ Schedule a date for the 2025-26 Budget and Budget session.
- ✓ Revise the 2025 Parliamentary sitting schedule to include a new Budget session and an inaugural Legislative Repeal Day to remove outdated and unnecessary laws from our Statutes.
- ✓ Begin consultation with Treasury and Agency Heads about accommodating our sensible and sustainable election commitments into the 2025-26 Budget.
- ✓ Re-introduce legislation and reinstate Committees delayed through the prorogation of Parliament and Dean Winter's election.

TAKE ACTION ON THE COST OF LIVING AND PROVIDE MORE HOUSING OPTIONS FOR TASMANIANS

In the first 100 days we will:

- ☒ Introduce legislation for consultation to establish **TasInsure** – our Tasmanian-owned and operated insurance company, ensuring Tasmanians pay less for insurance. This will enable **TasInsure** to be set up during 2026.
- ☒ Introduce legislation for the new \$30,000 First Home Owners Grant, helping young Tasmanians and families achieve the dream of owning their first home and stimulate the building and construction sector.
- ☒ Increase the value cap for new home construction in the MyHome Shared Equity program to \$800,000, encouraging even more Tasmanians to build under this successful program.
- ☒ Legislate to extend the payroll tax for apprentices, making it cheaper for employers to train our next generation of tradespeople.
- ☒ Immediately put in place a six-year freeze on new mandatory National Construction Code requirements, blocking federal red tape and giving builders and homebuyers certainty that tens of thousands of dollars won't be added to the price of their new home.
- ☒ Instruct Metro Tasmania and other operators to continue half-price bus fares for all passengers, from those on urban routes to regional and rural areas, as well as the Derwent River ferry, extended until 30 June 2026.
- ☒ Commence planning for the rollout of the new Statewide School Breakfast program in partnership with Variety Tasmania, for a staged start from Term 1, 2026.
- ☒ Help a further 400 Tasmanians into their own home by Stamping out Stamp Duty for first home buyers.
- ☒ Commence consultation on a Bill to crack down on building company phoenixing and dodgy builders.
- ☒ Continue to deliver more social and affordable homes in the next 100 days, in line with our commitment to deliver 10,000 social and affordable homes by 2032.
- ☒ Deliver a further 16 new homes under the Homes Tasmania Modular Construction Program with a further 200 modular homes to be added to the Program.
- ☒ Reintroduce legislation, delayed through Dean Winter's election, to amend the Residential Tenancy Act to allow renters to have a pet as a right.
- ☒ Release for consultation a Bill under the Housing Land Supply Act to speed up the process for making new Housing Land Supply Orders.
- ☒ Table the Crawford Review into Homes Tasmania and the Government's response, to improve the capability of Homes Tasmania to deliver for all Tasmanians.

BUILD AN EVEN BETTER HEALTH SYSTEM

In the first 100 days we will:

- ✓ Begin the process for putting in place the structure for our new life-saving meningococcal B vaccination program, from 1 January 2026, for all Tasmanian infants.
- ✓ Launch a short Expression of Interest process for four new 100 per cent bulk-billed clinics in Tasmania to be established in local communities, based on evidence of need.
- ✓ Release a revised draft LGH Precinct Master Plan for public consultation, including the brand new seven-storey tower at the Launceston General Hospital, boosting capacity by 250 beds.
- ✓ Commence planning and design work for the completion of the \$174 million Stage One of the North-West Hospitals Masterplan at the North-West Regional Hospital in Burnie and the Mersey Community Hospital in Latrobe.
- ✓ Begin consultation with paramedics, prior to drafting legislation for a new role of Paramedic Practitioner.
- ✓ Launch the scholarship program to upskill Registered Nurses to gain their Master of Nurse Practitioner qualifications.
- ✓ Begin work with the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners to deliver the training and supervision required for GPs to diagnose, treat and prescribe for Tasmanian children and adults living with ADHD.
- ✓ Introduce the Poisons Amendment (Interstate Prescriptions) Bill that will enable interstate prescriptions to be filled in Tasmania.
- ✓ Establish a working group to contemporise and strengthen the Tasmanian Pharmacy Control Act 2001.
- ✓ Working with key pharmacy stakeholders, make training available to community pharmacists to expand their scope of practice and enable them to treat 23 common health conditions.
- ✓ Begin an EOI process for a new grant program to extend operating hours for pharmacists where needed across Tasmania.
- ✓ Work with the Triabunna and Glenorchy communities on sites for permanent BreastScreen clinics in those communities.
- ✓ Begin the fit-out of the new \$15 million Tasmanian Breast Care Centre at the Royal Hobart Hospital's Liverpool Street Clinics.
- ✓ Work with the Huon Valley Council, local Huon community and existing local health services to determine the best site for the new purpose-built Medical Precinct for the Huon Valley, including a Mental Health Hub.
- ✓ Release a new Tasmanian Midwifery Strategy to address workforce retention, capacity, capability, and birth trauma.
- ✓ Commence design work for the construction of a dedicated CT scanner room at the St Helens District Hospital.
- ✓ Announce the new strategy to decrease sub-speciality paediatric waiting lists.
- ✓ Announce the next stage of the Transfer of Care Protocol, to reduce ambulance ramping at hospitals so paramedics can get back on the road faster to support more Tasmanians.

- ✓ Announce the outcomes of the tender for the delivery of aeromedical health services across Tasmania.
- ✓ Release the tender for the construction of the expanded Emergency Department Phase 2 at the Royal Hobart Hospital.
- ✓ Release a Tasmanian Nurse Practitioner Strategy and Action Plan for public consultation.
- ✓ Health Nexus to lodge the Development Application for the Latrobe Health and Wellbeing Precinct in partnership with the Government.
- ✓ Commence consultation for Rethink 2025 and beyond, Tasmania's long-term strategic plan for mental health.
- ✓ Open the North Medicare Mental Health Kids Hub, in partnership with the Australian Government, to provide secondary-level mental health assessment and interventions for children aged up to 12 years.
- ✓ Formalise an MOU between the Department of Health, Tasmania Police and other relevant authorities to enhance coordination and information sharing to combat illicit tobacco and vapes.
- ✓ Advocate to the Australian Government for continued national reform efforts to curb illicit tobacco and vape sales, and deeper coordination with agencies such as the Australian Border Force and the TGA.

DELIVER OUR STRONG PLAN FOR A STRONGER ECONOMY

In the first 100 days we will:

- ✓ Instruct Treasury to increase to \$5 million the share from the Heavy Vehicle Motor tax to be distributed to local councils to invest in road upgrades across Tasmania.
- ✓ Inform the Head of the State Service of Infrastructure Tasmania's oversight role across government for project assurance over major infrastructure and capital works projects valued at more than \$200 million.
- ✓ Progress updates to tax legislation, such as enhancing flexibility in land tax payment options.
- ✓ Establish a Government Business Charter for Growth, in partnership with the Tasmanian Chamber of Commerce and Industry, with a draft framework.
- ✓ TasPorts to identify a preferred contractor for the new \$15 million ship loader at the Port of Bell Bay, to enhance Tasmania's forestry export capabilities and economic infrastructure.
- ✓ Finalise a new Invasive Species Action Plan to tackle invasive species, including feral cats and rabbits.
- ✓ Open consultation on a new Long-term Agriculture Strategy to boost productivity and unlock opportunities across freight, agritourism, education, infrastructure and workforce development.
- ✓ Finalise work required to streamline Zone 1 permits for the eradication of deer under the Deer Management Plan.
- ✓ Progress work with key stakeholders to unlock more public or private land for recreational hunting to manage deer and improve access management tools.

- ✓ Launch a new online business continuity planning tool to complement the existing emergency event management information and tools available on the Business Tasmania website.

- ✓ Release the Government's single start-up permit draft legislation discussion paper, as part of our War on Red Tape.
- ✓ Announce the "Net Benefit Offsets" proposal, a contemporary model for Carbon Offsets, to allow for scientific research and development (not just land banking).
- ✓ Appoint the design and development contractor for the Macquarie Wharf 6 redevelopment project.
- ✓ Request that TasNetworks provide a briefing to the Minister for Energy within the first 100 days of Government on options to progress the works required to increase capacity and support the TRANSLink precinct's continued expansion.

- ✓ Task the Tasmanian Development Board with leading the development of a new Economic Diversification and Investment Strategy.

- ✓ TasPorts to finalise the upgrades at Port of Grassy, including navigational aids, installation of new lights, wharf flooding, buoys and an AIS/VHF antenna system.
- ✓ Convene a roundtable between MRT, TMEC, CCAA and AMEC on proposed legislative and regulatory changes to the Mineral Resources Development Act.
- ✓ Release the Critical Minerals Prospectus and work with industry to ensure the Critical Minerals Strategy is delivering the needs of industry.

- ✓ Announce recipients of the \$2.5 million capital investment grant program to assist communities and food providers transition from food relief to food resilience.
- ✓ Launch Tasmania's Food Resilience Strategy.
- ✓ Launch Tasmania's first Volunteering Strategy.
- ✓ Open expressions of interest for community members for the Older Tasmanians Advisory Body.
- ✓ Reintroduce the Sentencing Amendment (Aggravating Factors) Bill 2025.
- ✓ Open expressions of interest for members of the Ministerial Multicultural Advisory Group.
- ✓ Finalise the model of care for the new multi-systemic Divert and Connect Program for youth justice and commence recruitment to roll out Statewide.
- ✓ Honour the commitment in our original 2025-26 Budget for \$2.5 million for the Volunteer Infrastructure Investment Fund, to deliver upgrades to fire stations and SES units across Tasmania.
- ✓ Begin the process to expand the coverage of the Asbestos Compensation Act to cover SES volunteers for the first time, bringing SES volunteers in line with the protections already provided to firefighting, police and ambulance volunteers.
- ✓ Continue the Government's over \$400 million investment in implementing the 191 recommendations of the Commission of Inquiry.
- ✓ Hold immediate discussions with TasCOSS to accelerate the move to longer-term funding agreements and an outcomes framework.
- ✓ Establish a working group with the community sector to examine reducing red tape and the practice of multi-deed arrangements across government, easing the administrative burden for the sector.
- ✓ Commence reviewing the community budget submission process to provide funding certainty earlier in the budget cycle.
- ✓ Meet with family and sexual violence stakeholders on their workforce development strategy and needs.
- ✓ Hold discussions with the Department of Police, Fire and Emergency Services, and the Police Association of Tasmania, on a staged transition to a new rostering system for police.
- ✓ Re-introduce Daniel's Law to protect children from sexual predators, and reintroduce hooning legislation to protect community safety. Both Bills have been delayed by Dean Winter's election.
- ✓ Complete the Midway Point park and ride facility and commence construction on the Claremont park and ride facility.

- ☑ Open the new Launceston Regional Bus Transit Centre.
- ☑ Release the tender for the Bellerive ferry terminal.
- ☑ Introduce bail reform laws to Parliament.
- ☑ Reintroduce Bill to amend the Commission of Inquiry Act to remove barriers to individuals accessing information they provided for a private session with the COI. This important legislation was delayed because of Dean Winter's election.
- ☑ Release tender for the construction of works to widen and realign the Tasman Highway over 1.3 kilometres to the north of Triabunna, subject to federal environmental approvals.
- ☑ Release a consultation paper on improvements to our Family Violence legislation.
- ☑ Release the draft Local Government Electoral Bill for consultation.
- ☑ Release the Request for Tender for the enabling works, including demolition of the site, for the \$86.5 million Burnie Courts Complex.
- ☑ Commence construction of a new walking track from Godfreys Beach to the base of the Nut at Stanley, improving the visitor experience at The Nut State Reserve.
- ☑ Complete the first stage of track works for the Mount Montgomery-Mount Dial Loop Walking track in the Dial Range Reserve.
- ☑ Release site concept plan for public consultation on the Edge of the World Revitalisation Project.
- ☑ Release the tender for the construction of the \$28 million Glenorchy Sports Centre.
- ☑ Finalise detailed designs for the South Arm Highway/Acton Road intersection upgrade.
- ☑ Launch the Early Years Workforce Development Fund to grow the early childhood education and care workforce, with applications to be invited for scholarships to support students studying education and care qualifications who are working with a Tasmanian early childhood service.
- ☑ Release proposed dog welfare legislation for public consultation.
- ☑ Award the construction tender for the \$15.6 million upgrades to the security systems at the Risdon Prison Complex, including a new mobile duress alarm system for the improved safety of correctional officers.
- ☑ Appoint architects for the School Building Blitz at South George Town Primary School and Dodges Ferry Primary School.
- ☑ Commence works at initial schools for the Government's \$10 million school playground and sports courts upgrade program.
- ☑ Establish the School Staff Wellbeing Response Team, providing direct, specialist support to schools.
- ☑ Release the report and recommendations of an industry examination of accessible vehicle availability across Tasmania as part of the Government's Sustainable Disability Transport Solution, to ensure safe, secure and reliable transport for people with disability in Tasmania.
- ☑ Develop an agreement between the Government and Family Planning Tasmania for the delivery of outreach services across child and family learning centres around the state.

- ✓ Consult with key stakeholders on the commencement of Gaming Care officers to minimise the potential harm caused by gambling.
- ✓ Open the tender process to secure a second Registered Training Organisation to undertake firearm safety training in Tasmania.
